HOME ECONOMICS SECTION



Improving the standard of life of individuals, groups and communities by enhancing their skills and knowledge base

SKILLS TRAINING

The section provides and facilitates skills training for vulnerable individuals and groups of society.

The skills training aims at empowering these individuals with income generating skills with the aim of establishing viable and sustainable business ventures leading towards self-reliance.

The line of training is dependent upon the beneficiary's choice e.g. food preservation, sewing, bakery, blacksmith, art, pottery, basketry, textile crafts etc



MARKETING



The section aims at exposing small scale producers to local and international markets. The product should be able to withstand market demands (the project should be feasible and sustainable)

Products are promoted through regional shows and international fairs.

REHABILITATION

Home Economics also entails enlisting beneficiaries of S & CD relief programmes, such as Destitute Persons, CHBC and Orphan Care, in a participatory process aimed at empowering and restoring individuals, families and groups' functional level through change of attitude by engaging in sustainable social and economic activities.

POVERTY ERADICATION

The section is responsible for implementing the poverty eradication projects (Bakery, Fashion & Design, Food Catering & Hair Salon)
